## 2. State briefly the facts that support your request for an Urgent Operating Advice under category (a) or (b) above.

This update advice is issued following the on going investigations into a serious incident that occurred on 11<sup>th</sup> June 2008, at 13.55, at Margaretting (EA). Three people were injured when the basket of a Network Rail Unimog U400 RRV MEWP became detached from its boom whilst elevated. The investigation into this incident continues.

#### 4. What action has been taken to prevent recurrence and severe consequences?

Following consultation with the vehicle manufacturer, the head of Rail Vehicle Engineering Network Rail has decided that as the defective part of the equipment, is part of the demountable MEWP module, the host vehicles can now continue to be used, but only with the drum carrier module attached. The registrations of the affected 27 vehicles are :-

AE05 ETR, AE05 EOV, AE05 ETL, AE55 EOW, AE05 ETO, AE05 ETK, AE55 EOZ, AE05 SMO, AE05 SLZ, AE55 MZF, AE55 MZG, AE55 MZJ.

FN07 DWC, FM07 NVD, FN07 FZM, FM07 NWK, FJ57 PZV, FJ57 OPX, FN57 AEU, FD57 YGL, FA07 XWH, FD57 VKB, FD57 VXV, FD57 VNC, FN57 BYG, FN57 BZU, FD57 YKL.

The MEWP modules remain stood down and are not to be used until further notice.

Risk of operator injuries and/or damage to the infrastructure.
