





# User worked crossing with miniature stop lights



- Stop and check that the lights are working. If they are not, contact railway staff and wait for instructions.
- If you are crossing with vehicles or animals you must use the telephone to get permission to cross.
- You must not cross when the red light is on. If the red light stays on after a train has passed, do not cross because it means another train is coming.
- Only open the gates on both sides of the railway when the green light is on.
- If crossing with a vehicle consider how long it will take to cross. How heavy is your vehicle and load? What's the clearance of your vehicle – will it hit lines above or is there a risk of it grounding?
- If crossing with animals, consider how long it will take to cross and whether they are likely to stray onto the railway.
- Check that the green light is still on, cross quickly and stay alert. Do not stop on the crossing.
- Check that the green light is still on and close both gates after crossing. Never leave them open.



## How to use the crossing



01 Stop and check that the lights are working. If not, contact railway staff and act on their instructions.



02 You must use the telephone to get permission to cross if crossing with a vehicle or animals.



03 You must not cross when the red light is on. If the red light stays on after a train has passed, do not cross – another train is coming.



04 Only open the gates on both sides of the railway when the green light is on.



05 Check that the green light is still on and cross quickly and stay alert, do not stop on the crossing.



06 Check to see if the green light is still on and close both gates after crossing, never leave them open.



07 You must telephone railway staff after crossing if they ask you to.

### Pedestrians only

- Stop, look both ways and listen.
- Obey the lights. Cross quickly and stay alert
- Close the gates behind you, never leave them open.
