I was really concerned to hear about an alleged near miss with a railway colleague near Totnes, on our Western route last Wednesday.

Whilst the investigation is underway to get to the root cause of what happened, what we know so far is that railway colleagues were potentially seconds from death or serious injury. Whilst it's clearly good news, and we're thankful that everyone is OK, events like this are a warning to all of us that despite how far we've come there is always more we can do to ensure we fulfil our promise of 'Everyone home safe every day'.

This incident highlights the importance of ensuring work being undertaken on or near the line is done in compliance with the NR standard 'Safety of people at work on or near the line' (NR/L2/OHS/019).
